Nominations are now being accepted for the 2010 National Engineers Week Awards to be presented by the Central Pennsylvania Engineers Week Council.

The Engineers Week Council anticipates honoring three individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the engineering field with the following awards:

Engineer of the Year
Young Engineer of the Year
Technical Achievement Award

The awards will be presented at the National Engineers Week Banquet to be held on Thursday, February 25, 2010.

Nomination applications, including complete eligibility requirements for each of the awards, are attached with this e-mail. In addition, the applications are available to download from the Central Pennsylvania Engineers Week Council website (www.cpewc.com).

Applications must be submitted by e-mail, either as a Word document or in .pdf format, by the nominator. Applications received directly from the nominee for the award will not be accepted. Acceptance of the nomination by the award nominee will be obtained by e-mail after the application is received. No signatures or hard copy forms are required.

The Central Pennsylvania Engineers Week Council invites and strongly encourages nominations from each of the member organizations of the Engineers Week Council. There is no limit to the number of nominations that may be submitted by a member organization. A nominee does not need to be employed by a large company, or be involved with large, high profile projects to receive the award. The award criteria have been established to honor an overall outstanding person, not to recognize a specific project. The award recipient must have a combination of work and non-work related accomplishments to receive the award

Please discuss these awards at your next meeting and/or forward this information to your members. Because of the busy schedules we all have, please discuss these awards with your nominees as soon as possible to allow sufficient time to complete the application. Nominees from previous years should be considered again for the awards. In previous years, numerous nominees deserving of recognition have been submitted, and often there are only minor differences between other nominees and the award recipient. Because the nomination applications only have minor changes from year to year, minimal effort is needed to submit a previous nominee. Unfortunately, many excellent persons have been nominated in the past, and are then never submitted for consideration again.

All applications must be received by November 25, 2009.

Please note that a nominee may use others to assist in completing the application, and that although award recipients are invited to participate on the Engineers Week Council, there is no obligation to do so.
